Citizens already registered within the state on or before December 31, 2009 will not be required to provide evidence of citizenship upon re-registering if they move to another Georgia address. For those registering after January 1, 2010, once citizenship is demonstrated to a board of registrars, an elector will not be forced to resubmit proof of citizenship anywhere in Georgia as long as the person continuously remains an elector in the state.
