

Gonzales resigns Federal court throws out suit against Georgia ID law	Sept. 17, 2007	Submitted amicus brief in <i>ACLU of New Mexico v. Santillanes</i> (10th Cir.), showing the low rate of fraud and harm of ID laws
U.S. Supreme Court grants certiorari in Indiana voter ID case von Spakovsky nomination is passed out of committee, without recommendation	Sept. 25, 2007	Opposed the nomination of Hans von Spakovsky in the Senate Rules Committee, based in part on his work on voter fraud
	Oct. 3, 2007	After unprecedented committee report with no recommendation, opposed von Spakovsky nomination before the full Senate
	Oct. 23, 2007	Invited to panel of national experts on voter ID rules, hosted by American Constitution Society
	<u>Nov. 2007</u>	Published <i>The Truth About Voter Fraud</i> , analyzing common reasons for overstated claims of voter fraud
	Nov. 5, 2007	Worked with Senator Sheldon Whitehouse on S.2305, the <u>Caging Prohibition Act of 2007</u> , introduced today
	Nov. 13, 2007	Coordinated filing of 24 <i>amicus</i> briefs on behalf of 155 organizations and individuals in Supreme Court voter ID case, <i>Crawford v. Marion County Election Board</i> Includes Branco Contex being addressing slaims of voter freed.
