# Minnesota

### **Registration Deadline**

Forms must be received 21 days before an election, but the applicant may also register to vote on Election Day.<sup>1</sup>

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#### **Database Implementation Status**

Minnesota currently uses a top-down voter registration system in which county officials have direct access to the statewide database. The system was built in-house, with help from Arran Technology.<sup>2</sup>

### **Entering Voter Registration Information**

Who inputs voter registration information? County auditors generally review and enter information from voter registration forms in their jurisdictions into the database.<sup>3</sup>

What happens to voter registration forms submitted at state registration agencies? Forms received by the Secretary of State are sent by mail or fax, or scanned and sent electronically, to the appropriate county auditor for review and entry. Forms received at the Department of Public Safety's Driver and Vehicle Services Division ("DPS") are entered into the motor vehicles database; the entered information is sent electronically to the Secretary of State, for entry into the statewide voter registration database.

*How are most forms submitted?* In the Election Assistance Commission's 2004 survey, Minnesota did not report the distribution of how its voter registration forms were submitted.<sup>5</sup>

### **Voter Registration Form**

The relevant portions of the voter registration form are included at the end of this section.

### **Processing of Forms Without Identifying Numbers**

How will the state treat an application with an affirmative indication that the applicant has no valid identifying number? If the applicant is otherwise eligible, she will be issued a unique voter registration number, and will be considered registered.<sup>6</sup>

How will the state treat an application without an identifying number and without an affirmative indication that the applicant has no such number? If the applicant is otherwise eligible, the application will be sent through the matching process (see below), to determine if an identifying number can be found.

How will the state treat an application listing an identifying number that is either incomplete or illegible? If uncorrected (see below), the application will be classified as a "deficient registration," and rejected.

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### **Matching Against Motor Vehicle and Social Security Records**

What fields from the voter registration form will the state seek to match to motor vehicle or Social Security records? Identifying number, last name, first initial, and date of birth.<sup>7</sup>

How precise is the match standard? Minnesota uses a "substantial match" standard: if, even though the information compared may not be an exact match, the county auditor can still "reasonably conclude that the information [in two records]. . . relate[s] to the same person," the records will be deemed to match.<sup>8</sup>

How much human intervention is involved in determining whether information is matched? Minnesota first attempts to match records automatically, but county auditors then have the discretion to match unverified records from a list of possible matches.

Description of matching process: Each evening, the records of new applicants who have applied other than through the DPS are sent to the DPS for verification. (Forms submitted on Election Day will be matched after Election Day, but the match will not yield consequences for the instant election.) The system first automatically searches for an exact match of the identifying number, last name, first initial, and date of birth. If no match can be found, the system returns possible matches based on an exact match of either the identifying number or the last name, first initial, and date of birth. The Secretary of State submits the exact matches and possible matches to the county auditor, who reviews the possible matches to determine if the records reasonably relate to the same person. If so, the auditor will supplement that applicant's voter registration information with the missing identifying number. 10

What are the consequences if the state cannot find a match? If the identifying number matches but the records do not relate to the same individual, the registration will be considered "incomplete," and the applicant will be asked to provide a valid identifying number by the voter registration deadline or at the polls on Election Day. If the records relate to the same individual and the applicant submitted an identifying number that does not match, the auditor will replace the identifying number on the voter registration application with the number in the DPS system. If the records relate to the same individual and the applicant did not submit an identifying number, the application will be deemed "deficient," even though the county auditor has the ability to correct the deficiency. If no records are found that relate to the same individual and no matching number can be found, the auditor will assume that no identifying number has been issued; in the future, the system will then check the SSN-4, but at present the voter is simply considered registered, and a state identifying number is assigned.

## **Notice and Opportunity to Resolve Errors**

Does the applicant have the opportunity to correct a missing or incomplete identifying number, without submitting a new form? Yes. The applicant may correct missing or

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incomplete information by the voter registration deadline. If the applicant has not done so by the deadline, she must submit a new registration form on Election Day.<sup>14</sup>

Does the applicant have the opportunity to resolve a failed match, without submitting a new form? Yes. The applicant may submit information to resolve a failed match by the voter registration deadline or at the polls on Election Day.<sup>15</sup>

If information on an otherwise timely application is corrected after the voter registration deadline, is the correction timely? Yes. The applicant may correct information by the voter registration deadline or at the polls on Election Day. <sup>16</sup>

Description of notice and correction process: The county election official will attempt to notify, by phone, mail, or email, an applicant whose identifying number is incomplete or illegible – or an applicant who did not submit an identifying number but whose number was found in the DPS system. The applicant may submit a valid identifying number by the close of voter registration, or may re-register on Election Day. An applicant whose identifying number could not be verified will be notified that the registration was incomplete. A first-time voter registering by mail whose registration is incomplete must submit identification by the close of voter registration, or may re-register on Election Day. Any other voter whose registration is incomplete must present information allowing the county auditor to match her record to a record in the DMV database or to conclude that no such match is possible either by the close of voter registration or at the polls on Election Day.

### **Identification Requirements at the Polls**

Who must provide identification at the polls? A first-time voter registering by mail who has not previously submitted sufficient identification or arrived in person to re-register, and whose identifying number has not been verified, must re-register on

What forms of identification are accepted? A Minnesota driver's license with address; a Minnesota ID card with address; a tribal ID card with address; a current valid student ID card, fee statement, or registration card, with address; or a Minnesota driver's license, Minnesota ID card, tribal ID card, U.S. passport or military ID card, or Minnesota student ID card, together with a current utility bill showing name and address; or an affidavit from another registered voter or residential facility worker in the precinct vouching for the applicant's identity and signed in the presence of the election judge.<sup>24</sup>

What are the consequences of failing to show identification? The voter will not be able to cast a ballot.

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# **Statutes and Regulations**

MINN. STAT. ch. 201 generally concerns registration. MINN. STAT. §§ 201.021-.022 and MINN. R. 8200.9305 direct the Secretary of State to establish and maintain a single statewide voter registration database. MINN. R. pt. 8200 comprises the applicable regulations.
