## Registration Deadline

Forms must be received or postmarked 30 days before an election.<sup>1</sup>

## Database Implementation Status

South Carolina has been using a top-down voter registration system since 1968; county officials now directly access one centralized statewide database.<sup>2</sup>

## Entering Voter Registration Information

*Who inputs voter registration information?* County elections officials generally review and enter information from voter registration forms in their jurisdictions directly into the statewide system.

*What happens to voter registration forms submitted at state registration agencies?* Forms received by the Secretary of State or a voter registration agency are sent within ten days to the appropriate county elections board.<sup>3</sup> Forms received by the DMV are transmitted electronically to the appropriate county board on a nightly basis, and the paper backup copy is transmitted within 10 days.<sup>4</sup>

*How are most forms submitted?* South Carolina reported that in 2004, 42% of forms were submitted by mail, 50% were submitted at the DMV, 6% were submitted at another voter registration agency, and 2% were submitted by other means.<sup>5</sup>

## Processing of Forms Without Identifying Numbers

*How will the state treat an application with an affirmative indication that the applicant has no valid identifying number?* South Carolina's form does not clearly state how an applicant should indicate that she has no valid identifying number.

*How will the state treat an application without an identifying number and without an affirmative indication that the applicant has no such number?* If uncorrected (see below), the application will be rejected.<sup>6</sup>

*How will the state treat an application listing an identifying number that is either incomplete or illegible?* If uncorrected (see below), the application will be rejected.<sup>7</sup>

## Matching Against Motor Vehicle and Social Security Records

South Carolina does not attempt to match information on voter registration forms with information in the motor vehicles or Social Security databases for voter registration purposes.<sup>8</sup> South Carolina will attempt to match information submitted on voter registration forms to check for duplicate entries in the existing registration database, and will attempt to check an applicant's address against a street address file built from the county 911 and GIS (Geographic Information System) systems; if the address cannot be confirmed as valid, the application will be rejected.

## Notice and Opportunity to Resolve Errors

*Does the applicant have the opportunity to correct a missing or incomplete identifying number, without submitting a new form?* Yes. The applicant may correct missing or incomplete information at any point before Election Day.

*Does the applicant have the opportunity to resolve a failed match, without submitting a new form?* Not applicable.

*If information on an otherwise timely application is corrected after the voter registration deadline, is the correction timely?* Yes.

*Description of notice and correction process:* The county elections official will attempt to notify an applicant whose information is missing, incomplete, or illegible, by whatever means the county official chooses. The applicant may supply the missing information by phone, mail, or in person, at any point before Election Day.

## Identification Requirements at the Polls

*Who must to provide identification at the polls?* All voters must show identification.<sup>9</sup>

### Forms of ID:

*What forms of identification are accepted?* A driver's license or state-issued non-driver's photo identification card, or signed voter registration card.<sup>10</sup>

*What are the consequences of failing to show identification?* The voter may vote a provisional ballot. This ballot will be counted if the county board of canvassers certifies that the voter is a validly registered active voter who is eligible to vote in that jurisdiction; a county may choose to count the ballot if the state's error prevented valid registration for some reason.<sup>11</sup>

## Statutes and Regulations

S.C. CODE ANN. §§ 7-5-110 *et seq.* generally concern registration. S.C. CODE ANN. § 7-3-20 directs the executive director of the State Election Commission to establish and maintain a master file of qualified electors. There are no applicable regulations.

\*\* Social Security Number is required by the S.C. Code of Laws 7-5-170. This number is used for internal purposes only and eliminates multiple registrations by a single individual. Your Social Security Number is not released to any unauthorized individual.
