

States have made encouraging progress in how we use electronic voting.


Positive Trends on Voting

VOTE-BY-MAIL REQUEST CARD

Colorado Driver's License Number I do not have a Colorado Driver's License or Dept. of Revenue Identification Number. OR If do not have a Colorado Driver's License, or a Department of Revenue Identification Number then provide at least the last four digits of your Social Security Number. Social Security Number I do not have a Social Security Number.
Last four digits of Social Security number A copy of your current and valid photo photo identification, military identification, current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paychack, or other government document that shows your name and current address. (Note: You cannot use as proof of identification a notice that the board of elections mailed to you.)







Brennan Center found racial disparity in no-match rate.




II. Voter Purges

Voter Purges

From 2004 to 2006:

13 million voters were purged from the rolls.



Voter Purges

In some states over the past two months:

For every one voter registered to vote, two were removed from the rolls.



Voter Purges

Yes, good housekeeping, but voter purges are:

- Shrouded in secrecy
- Full of errors
- Vulnerable to partisan manipulation

Voter Purges: Problems This Year

- Mississippi Official purged 10,000 voters from her *home computer* one week before the primary
- Muscogee, Georgia 700 "felony convictions" many wrongly included.
- Louisiana 21,000 voters purged for voting in other states no ability to prove they had not registered
- Colorado SOS admits: at least 2,454 illegally purged

III. Partisan Voter Challenges

Partisan Voter Challenges

The system creates opportunities for partisans to challenge the legitimacy of any voter *before or on Election Day*.

For example, Michigan GOP will place 4,000 challengers at the polls.

Partisan Voter Challenges: Montana



First Lieutenant Kevin Furey

- 6,000 voters challenged
 - Students
 - Native Americans
 - Low-income voters


Partisan Voter Challenges: Michigan

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Partisan Voter Challenges: Indiana

- "We might end up challenging on that. It's entirely possible. I think it would be a solid basis for asking someone to vote provisionally."
 - Marion County GOP Chairman Tom John
- "A notice of foreclosure is not legal proof that someone doesn't live in their home. I think this tactic can be used to embarrass or intimidate voters or slow down the process."

Solutions?

Inadequate Solutions: Provisional Ballots

70% rejected in Wisconsin

rejected in March primary in Ohio

"The bottom line is that the casting of a proper, traditional ballot constitutes a vote, while the casting or submission of a provisional ballot does not."

– Election Assistance Commission (Sept. 2005)

Short Term Solutions: Voters

What Voters Should Do:

- Make sure you are registered to vote in advance
- Don't take no for an answer, demand an emergency ballot
- Call the hotline if all fails, demand a provisional ballot



Short Term Solution: What Officials Should Do

- Stop purging (NVRA deadline has passed)
- Provide clear instructions on challenging
- Have enough emergency paper ballots at polling places

Long Term Solution: Universal Voter Registration

"The registration laws in force throughout the United States are among the world's most demanding ... [and are] one reason why voter turnout in the United States is near the bottom of the developed world."

Long Term Solution: Universal Voter Registration

Making registration automatic and permanent – and shifting the responsibility to the government – would improve the current process:

- Would add up to 50 million voters to the rolls.
- Protects against errors and fraud.
- Accurate voter lists = fewer last minute crunches
- Election Day registration would protect the right to vote from government mistakes.
