QUICK FIX

- **A nearly 20 percent drop in U.S. exports to China in March from 2017 levels is not helping the case to preserve President Donald Trump's "phase one" trade deal**, which he threatened to cancel if Beijing failed to meet its purchase commitments.
- **The United States and United Kingdom today kick off Day Two of online trade negotiations**. Both sides say they're working at a "fast pace" to reach a "comprehensive" deal, but they have not offered a target date for completion and still seem far apart on sticking points including U.S. meat exports.
- **Republican Sen. Josh Hawley wants to throw out the World Trade Organization**. He says that's the only way for the U.S. to confront the threat of China and "rebuild" the American economy.

DRIVING THE DAY

PLAYING CATCH UP ON CHINA EXPORTS: Trump's "phase one" deal with China could quickly become a casualty, if Commerce Department numbers showing a big drop in U.S. exports to the country is any indication.

U.S. exports to China in March totaled \$7.9 billion, an 18 percent drop from the same month in 2017, according to a Commerce report. The stat raises questions about whether Beijing can meet the benchmarks set out in the deal to increase purchases of U.S. goods and services by \$200 billion above 2017 levels over two years. That includes \$76.7 billion in increased purchases in year one and \$123.3 billion in year two.

Trump this week threatened to "terminate" the agreement if China fails to meet those purchasing commitments, which could open the door for Trump to impose additional tariffs on Chinese goods.

Holding China accountable: Trump could cancel the deal as a way to take action against China for its handling of the coronavirus at the outset of the outbreak.

He has sent mixed signals about his approach to China. He said his trade deal would be "secondary" to any action he might take toward Beijing over the virus, and senior White House adviser Matthew Pottinger said Monday the U.S. was not planning to impose "punitive measures" on China.

But Trump on Tuesday reiterated that he wants to see China be "transparent" with regard to the pandemic. "We want to find out what happened so it never happens again," he told reporters outside the White House, though he added he has not spoken to Chinese President Xi Jinping about his frustrations with how China handled the virus.

Administration officials have said there is no imminent action to retaliate against China but that imposing more tariffs on Chinese products — on top of the continued tariffs on more than \$360 billion worth of Chinese goods — remains an option, CNN reported Tuesday.

Hearing from the chorus: China hawks are clamoring to hold Beijing accountable for what they view as a cover-up by the Chinese government in the early days of the virus. That call will only grow, depending on the results of an administration investigation into the origins of the virus.

"Abandoning phase 1 is a necessary step but will have little impact, since there probably won't be much to abandon. Congress was not allowed to ratify it and the decision is entirely in President Trump's hands," American Enterprise Institute resident scholar Derek Scissors wrote in a blog.

Cold comfort?: The U.S. trade deficit with China was the lowest in 16 years, as imports from there fell to their lowest level in 11 years. That decrease is likely more a reflection of reduced output and a decrease in demand felt on both sides of the Pacific, but it could give some comfort to Trump, who has been obsessed with lowering the deficit.

U.S., U.K. GET STARTED ON TRADE TALKS: The U.S. and U.K. will continue online trade negotiations today with more than 200 negotiators working in nearly 30 different negotiating groups to cover all aspects of a “comprehensive” trade deal, the two countries said in a joint statement Tuesday announcing the formal launch of talks.

Multiple virtual meetings will take place from today until May 15.

"This will be an historic agreement that is consistent with U.S. priorities and the negotiating objectives established by Congress in U.S. law," U.S. Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer said.

What's the timeline? Lighthizer and U.K. Secretary of State for International Trade Elizabeth Truss did not offer a target date for concluding talks. But U.S. trade officials must sign the agreement by April 1, 2021, if they want to submit it to Congress under the expedited approval process of the 2015 trade promotion authority law, which expires three months later.

Prior to the pandemic, U.S. officials had expressed a desire to wrap up negotiations by the end of 2020. But the negotiations were long expected to be challenging in such a tight timeframe as the U.K. government navigates Trump's demands while figuring out a new trading relationship with the stricter European Union.

Plus, talks are taking place during the U.K.'s transition period after Brexit, and any deal wouldn't go into effect until after the transition period ends. (As of now, that date is Dec. 31.)

Gearing up for tough talks: One sticking point could be the U.K.'s resistance to importing U.S. beef produced with artificial growth hormones or U.S. poultry meat cleaned with antimicrobial washes.

"We have made clear that we do not expect to lower our standards in those areas or change them," Her Majesty's Trade Commissioner for North America Antony Phillipson said.

He also ruled out any changes to Britain's National Health Service, including "our approach to drug pricing," despite pressure from U.S. pharmaceutical companies on that point.

One big deal, please: The U.S. Chamber of Commerce and its U.S.-U.K. Business Council on Tuesday urged both sides to reach a single, comprehensive trade deal instead of the phased approach that has been the Trump administration's general strategy in trade talks.

The business groups are positioning a deal as a bright spot of potential economic growth amid the destruction caused by the pandemic. "The COVID-19 pandemic makes this growth more imperative than ever," the groups wrote in a 16-page document of updated priorities.

FEMA'S 'PROJECT AIRBRIDGE': THE LATEST NUMBERS: FEMA's Project Airbridge initiative has brought to the U.S. nearly a billion medical supplies between March 29 and May 4, with about 18 percent originating from China, according to an agency spokesperson.

The initiative, which aims to expedite air shipments of medical supplies to areas of the country that need them most, has brought in more than 172 million medical supplies from China, including N95 respirators, gloves, surgical masks, surgical gowns, thermometers and face shields. Supplies are also being sourced from manufacturers in Thailand, Malaysia, Vietnam, Taiwan, India, Honduras and Mexico.

The breakdown: Between March 29 and May 4, Airbridge imports included: 768,000 N95 respirators, 874 million gloves, 79.1 million surgical masks, 13.3 million surgical gowns, 2.2 million thermometers, 742,000 face shields, 324,000 coveralls, 109,000 stethoscopes, 370,000 oxygen masks, 250,000 swabs and 160,000 cannulas, according to the FEMA spokesperson.

3M's N95 order: U.S. manufacturer 3M is on the hook for 166.5 million N95 respirators after the president invoked the Defense Production Act to compel the company to deliver more of those medical supplies. The respirators are being produced in 3M factories in China, South Korea and Singapore and will be delivered through June.

EX-IM BRINGS IN NEW FACE TO LEAD CHINA PROGRAM: David Trulio, former senior adviser and chief of staff to the Defense undersecretary for policy, has been appointed senior vice president for the U.S. Export-Import Bank's new "Program on China and Transformational Exports," which aims to raise the U.S.'s ability to compete with China. Trulio will also serve as a counselor to Ex-Im Chairman Kimberly Reed.

Trulio will be responsible for establishing that new initiative, which was mandated by Congress in the law it passed late last year to reauthorize Ex-Im for seven years. Congress required that 20 percent of Ex-Im's total financing authority, or \$27 billion, be reserved for exports that

compete directly with China. The goal is to support direct exports to countries in key areas like artificial intelligence, biotechnology, renewable energy and semiconductors.

HAWLEY: ABOLISH THE WTO: Hawley on Tuesday called for abolishing the World Trade Organization and efforts to preserve the current global economic system. In a New York Times op-ed, Hawley argued that abandoning the WTO would be a good start toward combating “the single greatest threat to American security in the 21st century, Chinese imperialism.”

“The quest to turn the world into a liberal order of democracies was always misguided. It always depended on unsustainable American sacrifice and force of arms. And its companion economic order has, in similar vein, succeeded mostly in weakening American workers and industry,” he wrote.

Where Trump stands: Trump has reportedly expressed in private his desire to withdraw the U.S. from the WTO, though he publicly denied it in 2018. His administration has also ramped up the U.S.’s years-long grievances against the WTO’s Appellate Body. Still, pushing for reform is a different animal than trashing the entire global body.

Lots of pushback: Hawley’s op-ed ignited a lot of criticism from trade followers on Twitter, with the National Taxpayers Union doing a fact-check blog post of certain claims by the Missouri Republican.

NTU’s Bryan Riley pushed back on Hawley’s argument that “foreign agriculture won concession after concession, while American farmers struggled to get fair access to markets.” The group pulled USDA data to show that U.S. agricultural exports have more than doubled since the WTO was created, adding that “leaving the WTO would be a devastating blow to farmers and ranchers, who increasingly rely on world trade.”

“Sen. Hawley is entitled to his own opinions, but not his own facts. The facts show that Americans have benefited tremendously from growing trade and investment under the WTO,” Riley wrote.

CATO Institute’s Simon Lester also explained that “pulling out of the WTO would be counterproductive for the goal of opening up the Chinese market. Chinese tariffs were higher before it joined the WTO, and if the U.S. pulls out of the WTO, U.S. producers would face higher tariffs on their exports to China than their competitors do.”

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U.S. Department of Commerce invests \$2 million to support Pine Bluff economic group

Talk Business & Politics (AR)

U.S. Secretary of Commerce Wilbur Ross announced that the Department's Economic Development Administration (EDA) is awarding a \$2 million grant to the Southeast Arkansas Economic Development District, Inc., (SEAEDD) of Pine Bluff to establish a new headquarters facility in Pine Bluff. The EDA grant will be matched with \$399,000 in local investment. "The Trump Administration is committed to strengthening community-led economic development planning and natural disaster recovery efforts," said Secretary of Commerce Wilbur Ross. "SEAEDD's new economic development headquarters will provide the centralized, modern space necessary to advance the community's economic development and disaster resiliency plans."

Floyd Co. to receive \$2.3 million federal grant for local business growth, natural disaster relief

WDBL7 (VA)

Floyd County will be the recipient of a multi-million-dollar federal grant toward the construction of the Floyd Growth Center Building set to provide space and assistance for new businesses to grow and support for others during natural disasters. According to a press release from the U.S. Department of Commerce, the Economic Development Authority of Floyd County will receive a \$2.3 million grant estimated to bring another \$5 million through private investment.

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DRIVING THE DAY

PLAYING CATCH UP ON CHINA EXPORTS: Trump's "phase one" deal with China could quickly become a casualty, if Commerce Department numbers showing a big drop in U.S. exports to the country is any indication.

U.S. exports to China in March totaled \$7.9 billion, an 18 percent drop from the same month in 2017, according to a Commerce report. The stat raises questions about whether Beijing can meet the benchmarks set out in the deal to increase purchases of U.S. goods and services by \$200 billion above 2017 levels over two years. That includes \$76.7 billion in increased purchases in year one and \$123.3 billion in year two.

Trump this week threatened to “terminate” the agreement if China fails to meet those purchasing commitments, which could open the door for Trump to impose additional tariffs on Chinese goods.

Holding China accountable: Trump could cancel the deal as a way to take action against China for its handling of the coronavirus at the outset of the outbreak.

He has sent mixed signals about his approach to China. He said his trade deal would be “secondary” to any action he might take toward Beijing over the virus, and senior White House adviser Matthew Pottinger said Monday the U.S. was not planning to impose “punitive measures” on China.

But Trump on Tuesday reiterated that he wants to see China be “transparent” with regard to the pandemic. “We want to find out what happened so it never happens again,” he told reporters outside the White House, though he added he has not spoken to Chinese President Xi Jinping about his frustrations with how China handled the virus.

Administration officials have said there is no imminent action to retaliate against China but that imposing more tariffs on Chinese products — on top of the continued tariffs on more than \$360 billion worth of Chinese goods — remains an option, CNN reported Tuesday.

Hearing from the chorus: China hawks are clamoring to hold Beijing accountable for what they view as a cover-up by the Chinese government in the early days of the virus. That call will only grow, depending on the results of an administration investigation into the origins of the virus.

“Abandoning phase 1 is a necessary step but will have little impact, since there probably won’t be much to abandon. Congress was not allowed to ratify it and the decision is entirely in President Trump’s hands,” American Enterprise Institute resident scholar Derek Scissors wrote in a blog.

Cold comfort?: The U.S. trade deficit with China was the lowest in 16 years, as imports from there fell to their lowest level in 11 years. That decrease is likely more a reflection of reduced

output and a decrease in demand felt on both sides of the Pacific, but it could give some comfort to Trump, who has been obsessed with lowering the deficit.

U.S., U.K. GET STARTED ON TRADE TALKS: The U.S. and U.K. will continue online trade negotiations today with more than 200 negotiators working in nearly 30 different negotiating groups to cover all aspects of a “comprehensive” trade deal, the two countries said in a joint statement Tuesday announcing the formal launch of talks.

Multiple virtual meetings will take place from today until May 15.

"This will be an historic agreement that is consistent with U.S. priorities and the negotiating objectives established by Congress in U.S. law," U.S. Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer said.

What's the timeline? Lighthizer and U.K. Secretary of State for International Trade Elizabeth Truss did not offer a target date for concluding talks. But U.S. trade officials must sign the agreement by April 1, 2021, if they want to submit it to Congress under the expedited approval process of the 2015 trade promotion authority law, which expires three months later.

Prior to the pandemic, U.S. officials had expressed a desire to wrap up negotiations by the end of 2020. But the negotiations were long expected to be challenging in such a tight timeframe as the U.K. government navigates Trump's demands while figuring out a new trading relationship with the stricter European Union.

Plus, talks are taking place during the U.K.'s transition period after Brexit, and any deal wouldn't go into effect until after the transition period ends. (As of now, that date is Dec. 31.)

Gearing up for tough talks: One sticking point could be the U.K.'s resistance to importing U.S. beef produced with artificial growth hormones or U.S. poultry meat cleaned with antimicrobial washes.

"We have made clear that we do not expect to lower our standards in those areas or change them," Her Majesty's Trade Commissioner for North America Antony Phillipson said.

He also ruled out any changes to Britain's National Health Service, including "our approach to drug pricing," despite pressure from U.S. pharmaceutical companies on that point.

One big deal, please: The U.S. Chamber of Commerce and its U.S.-U.K. Business Council on Tuesday urged both sides to reach a single, comprehensive trade deal instead of the phased approach that has been the Trump administration's general strategy in trade talks.

The business groups are positioning a deal as a bright spot of potential economic growth amid the destruction caused by the pandemic. "The COVID-19 pandemic makes this growth more imperative than ever," the groups wrote in a 16-page document of updated priorities.

FEMA'S 'PROJECT AIRBRIDGE': THE LATEST NUMBERS: FEMA's Project Airbridge initiative has brought to the U.S. nearly a billion medical supplies between March 29 and May 4, with about 18 percent originating from China, according to an agency spokesperson.

The initiative, which aims to expedite air shipments of medical supplies to areas of the country that need them most, has brought in more than 172 million medical supplies from China, including N95 respirators, gloves, surgical masks, surgical gowns, thermometers and face shields. Supplies are also being sourced from manufacturers in Thailand, Malaysia, Vietnam, Taiwan, India, Honduras and Mexico.

The breakdown: Between March 29 and May 4, Airbridge imports included: 768,000 N95 respirators, 874 million gloves, 79.1 million surgical masks, 13.3 million surgical gowns, 2.2 million thermometers, 742,000 face shields, 324,000 coveralls, 109,000 stethoscopes, 370,000 oxygen masks, 250,000 swabs and 160,000 cannulas, according to the FEMA spokesperson.

3M's N95 order: U.S. manufacturer 3M is on the hook for 166.5 million N95 respirators after the president invoked the Defense Production Act to compel the company to deliver more of those medical supplies. The respirators are being produced in 3M factories in China, South Korea and Singapore and will be delivered through June.

EX-IM BRINGS IN NEW FACE TO LEAD CHINA PROGRAM: David Trulio, former senior adviser and chief of staff to the Defense undersecretary for policy, has been appointed senior vice president for the U.S. Export-Import Bank's new "Program on China and Transformational Exports," which aims to raise the U.S.'s ability to compete with China. Trulio will also serve as a counselor to Ex-Im Chairman Kimberly Reed.

Trulio will be responsible for establishing that new initiative, which was mandated by Congress in the law it passed late last year to reauthorize Ex-Im for seven years. Congress required that 20 percent of Ex-Im's total financing authority, or \$27 billion, be reserved for exports that compete directly with China. The goal is to support direct exports to countries in key areas like artificial intelligence, biotechnology, renewable energy and semiconductors.

HAWLEY: ABOLISH THE WTO: Hawley on Tuesday called for abolishing the World Trade Organization and efforts to preserve the current global economic system. In a New York Times

op-ed, Hawley argued that abandoning the WTO would be a good start toward combating “the single greatest threat to American security in the 21st century, Chinese imperialism.”

“The quest to turn the world into a liberal order of democracies was always misguided. It always depended on unsustainable American sacrifice and force of arms. And its companion economic order has, in similar vein, succeeded mostly in weakening American workers and industry,” he wrote.

Where Trump stands: Trump has reportedly expressed in private his desire to withdraw the U.S. from the WTO, though he publicly denied it in 2018. His administration has also ramped up the U.S.’s years-long grievances against the WTO’s Appellate Body. Still, pushing for reform is a different animal than trashing the entire global body.

Lots of pushback: Hawley’s op-ed ignited a lot of criticism from trade followers on Twitter, with the National Taxpayers Union doing a fact-check blog post of certain claims by the Missouri Republican.

NTU’s Bryan Riley pushed back on Hawley’s argument that “foreign agriculture won concession after concession, while American farmers struggled to get fair access to markets.” The group pulled USDA data to show that U.S. agricultural exports have more than doubled since the WTO was created, adding that “leaving the WTO would be a devastating blow to farmers and ranchers, who increasingly rely on world trade.”

“Sen. Hawley is entitled to his own opinions, but not his own facts. The facts show that Americans have benefited tremendously from growing trade and investment under the WTO,” Riley wrote.

CATO Institute’s Simon Lester also explained that “pulling out of the WTO would be counterproductive for the goal of opening up the Chinese market. Chinese tariffs were higher before it joined the WTO, and if the U.S. pulls out of the WTO, U.S. producers would face higher tariffs on their exports to China than their competitors do.”
