

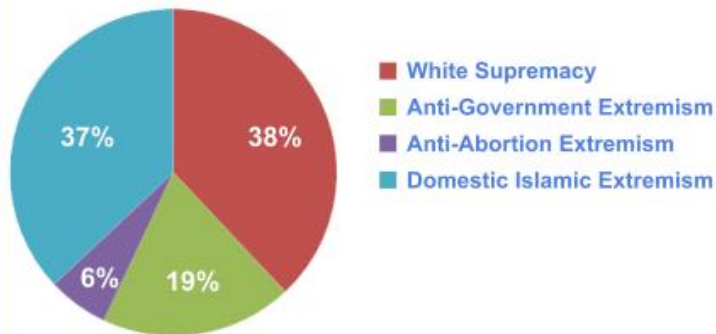

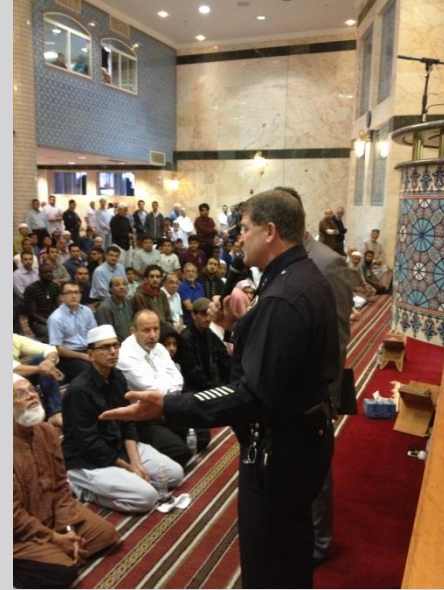
## LAPD Counter-Terrorism and Special Operations Bureau (CTSOB) LIAISON PROGRAM



The CTSOB Liaison Unit utilizes innovative techniques through

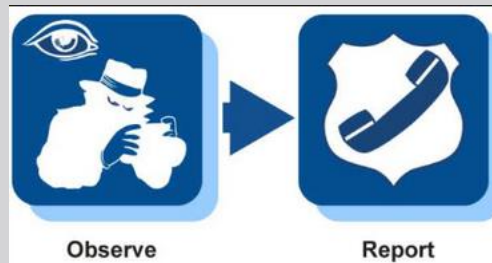

## Suspicious Activity Report (SAR) Program



**SAR's** are used to document any reported or observed activity, or any criminal act or attempted criminal act, which an officer believes may reveal a **nexus to foreign or domestic terrorism**.

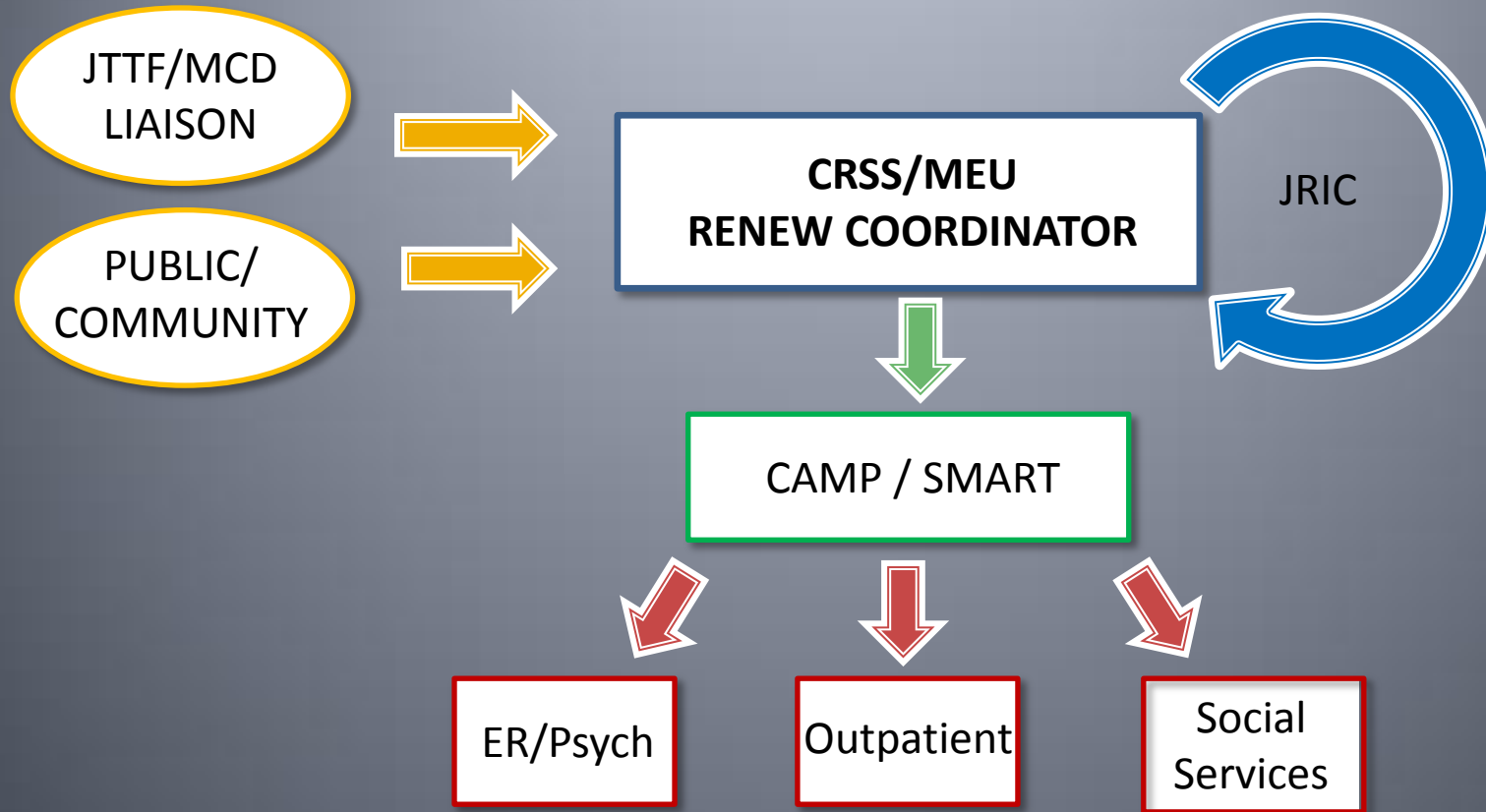

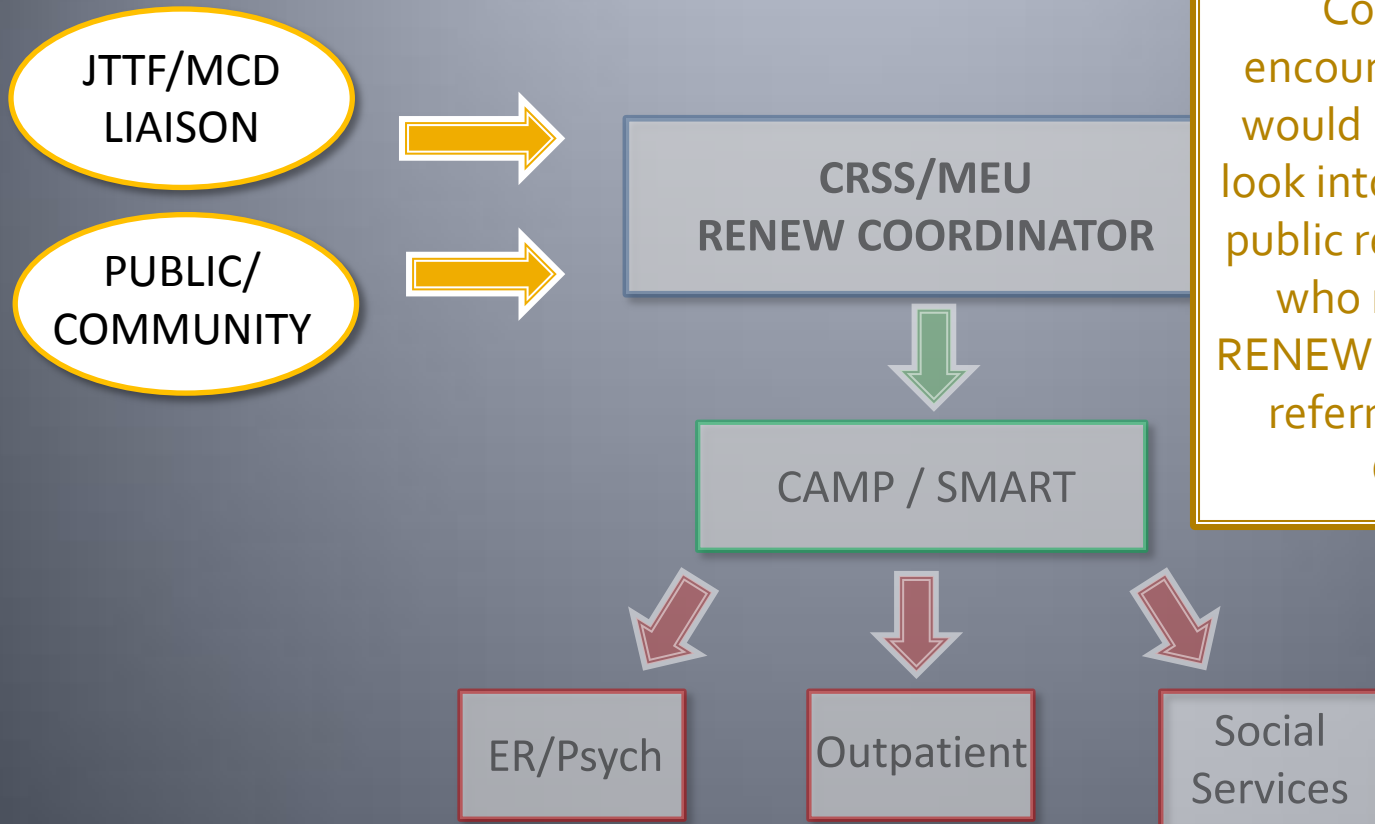

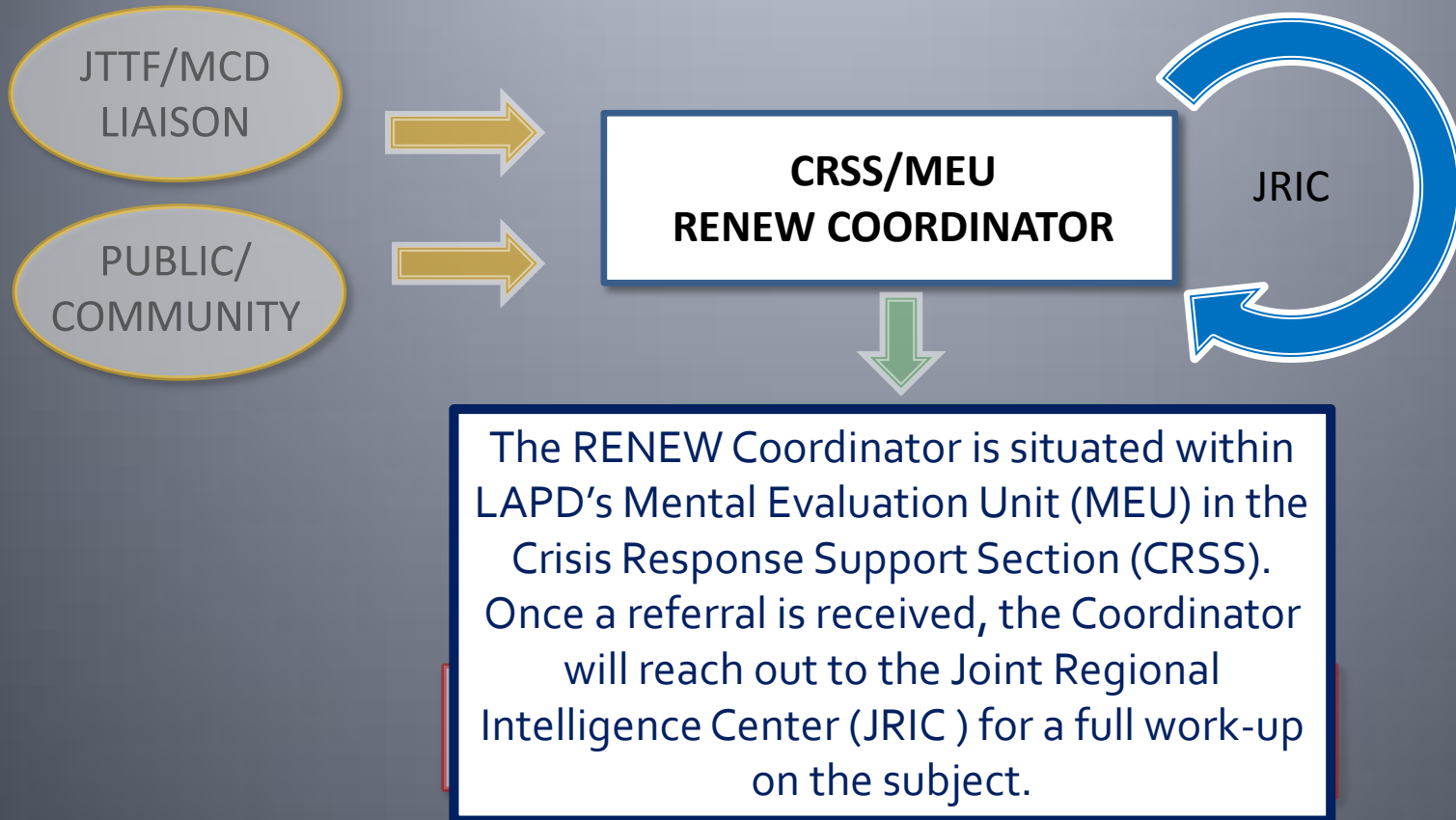


# RENEW Process

The Case Assessment Management Program (CAMP) is a joint LAPD-LA Department of Mental Health program that track incidents created by individuals who may be suffering from mental illness.

The System-Wide Mental Assessment Response Team (SMART) is another joint LAPD-LA Department of Mental Health program that provides crisis intervention for field officers without unnecessary incarceration or hospitalization.

2. Outpatient Therapy Suggested. While the subject is not an immediate danger, they are exhibiting signs of mental illness that are best served through an Outpatient therapy program.
3. Subjects would benefit from Social Services. In this instance, there may be no mental illness, but the subject may be isolated and would respond well to better integration with community or social services such as a mentorship, cross-cultural program, or advise about other resources available to them.

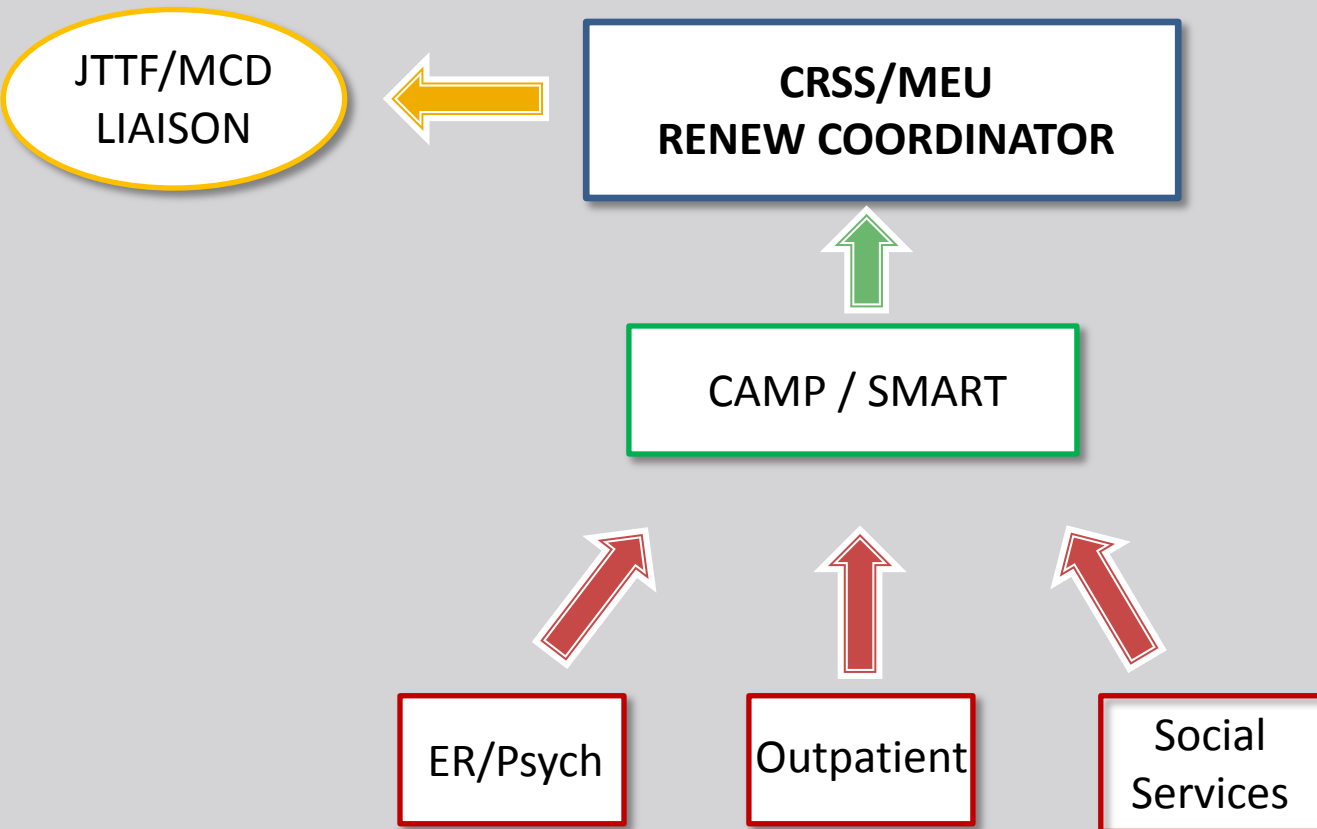

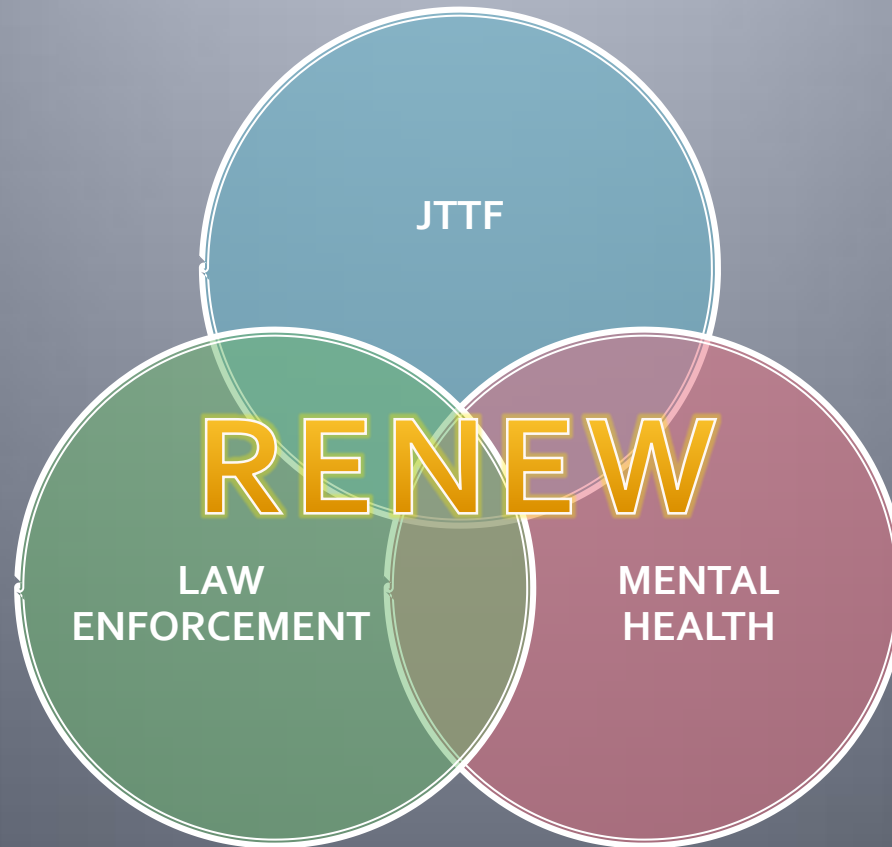
# RENEW Process
