Dear Chairwoman Mikulski, Ranking Member Shelby, Chairman Mollohan, and Ranking Member Wolf:

We commend you for demonstrating your strong support for the Legal Services Corporation (LSC) in your respective versions of the FY10 funding bill for Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies.

This year, both the House and Senate took important steps in removing specific restrictions on the activities of legal aid programs that receive LSC funds. As you know, legal aid programs have been severely impacted by the economic and housing crises. These organizations have been hit hard by interest rate drops since many depend heavily on the interest earned from the short-term deposits that lawyers hold in trust for clients (IOLTA accounts). In addition, cash-strapped state governments have been forced to curb their aid to legal services organizations. These funding setbacks are occurring while legal aid programs are seeing a record number of incoming requests from individuals across the country who are unable to afford a private attorney to handle civil matters related to foreclosures or matters related to unemployment.

Both the House-passed provision relating to attorneys' fees and the committee-passed Senate provision relating to non-federal funds will help to alleviate the impact of the funding shortfalls being faced by legal aid societies, and we urge you to include both provisions in any final conference agreement.

More significant of these two important changes, the Senate language relating to the restriction on use of non-federal funds will go farther towards improving the resources available to legal aid programs and permitting them to operate more efficiently. Access to private contributions has never been more crucial for these organizations, and the Senate language would remove some restrictions on the use of these funds. The Obama Administration has also urged Congress to lift

this restriction. In a June 16, 2009 "Statement of Administration Policy," the Administration expressed its concern that all citizens have access to legal representation and urged Congress to remove this part of the rider. In light of the vast need, we also urge you to adopt the House's funding level of \$440 million for LSC in FY10.

The work that LSC engages in has perhaps never been more crucial to our constituents and our communities than it is right now.
