**DECLARATION OF  
JOSE LOPEZ-SANDIN**

I, Jose Lopez-Sandin, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am 20 years old, a United States citizen, and a resident of the state of Florida. I live at 18352 NW 11<sup>th</sup> Street, Pembroke Pines, FL 33029. I used to live at 17454 SW 31<sup>st</sup> Ct, Miramar, Florida 33029. I left my address at 17454 SW 31<sup>st</sup> Ct in approximately March of 2007. I have never been convicted of a felony, and I have never been found mentally incapacitated with respect to voting.
2. I was born in Puerto Rico and have lived in the state of Florida for nearly nine years.
3. In the fall of 2006, I attempted to register to vote at the Biscayne Bay campus of Florida International University. I filled out and submitted a complete voter registration form. At the time, I was living at 17454 SW 31<sup>st</sup> Ct, Miramar, FL 33029.
4. I wrote down my name, address, date of birth, telephone number, and the last four digits of my Social Security number on the voter registration form, and otherwise completed the

form as required. To the best of my knowledge, the information I wrote down was, and is, accurate.

5. I have never received any notification from Broward County or from the State of Florida -- by mail, phone, or otherwise -- that there was a problem with my registration application.

6. My girlfriend, who applied to vote in 2006, received a voter information card before the election on November 7, 2006, confirming that she was registered to vote. I did not receive any such confirmation before November 7, 2006. Because I did not receive any confirmation, I believed that I was not registered to vote, although I did not know the reason why I was not registered. Although I had wanted to vote in the election, I did not attempt to vote on November 7, 2006 because I believed that I was not registered to vote. I would have voted in the election if my registration application had been accepted.

7. If I had been informed of any problem with my registration application and given information as to how to fix it, I would have taken steps to resolve the problem.

8. Since the election, I have been informed that the official voter registration records of the State show an entry for "Joseph Lopez-Sandin," living at the address where I was living (17454 SW 31<sup>st</sup> Ct, Miramar, Florida). "Joseph Lopez-Sandin" was not registered due to a "match error." I believe that this record reflects my application, but with a spelling error that I did not create.


9. The voter record lists my name as "Joseph Lopez-Sandin". See Attachment A. I have never been known as Joseph, nor have I used that name. I did not write "Joseph" on my voter registration application. I do not know why my first name was listed on the official voter records as Joseph.

10. On my Social Security card, my name is listed as Jose Antonio Lopez Sandin, without the hyphen in my last name. I consider my last name to be "Lopez-Sandin". To the best of my recollection, I always use a hyphen when writing my name, and I recall that I used a hyphen when filling out my voter registration application.

11. I reasonably believe that my voter registration application was not accepted, and that I was not registered to vote, because the first name or the last name entered into the voter registration system did not match information on other government records.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Florida that the foregoing is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

**DECLARATION OF  
EUGENE RICHARD  
MCKENNA**

I, Eugene Richard McKenna, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am 68 years old, a United States citizen, and a resident of the state of Florida. My address is 1109 NE 15th Ave, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, 33304. I have never been convicted of a felony, and I have never been found mentally incapacitated with respect to voting.
2. I moved to Florida from New York state in January of 2005. I am a long time voter and have been voting since the age of 21.
3. My Social Security card lists my name as Eugene Richard McKenna.
4. On or about March of 2006, I attempted to register to vote in person at the Broward County Supervisor of Elections office. Due to the fact that I am blind in my left eye, a Broward County Supervisor of Elections clerk assisted me with completing and submitting my voter registration application. I recited my name, address, and date of birth, and showed documentation to the clerk who entered the information into a voter registration application.

Because I do not have a Florida driver's license, I provided my Social Security number to the clerk.

5. As Election Day in 2006 neared, I became concerned because I had not received my voter registration card in the mail. I do not believe that I ever received a letter or notice indicating that there was a problem with my application.

6. Before Election Day, I called the Broward County Supervisor of Elections to inquire about my voter registration status. I was told that my voter registration application had been rejected because there was a problem with my application. I asked if I could correct the problem and register in time to vote. The official said that I could not correct the problem in time to be eligible to vote because the deadline had already passed. The official never informed me of the provisional balloting rules. I wanted to vote in the 2006 election, and I would have voted if my registration application had been accepted.

7. After the election, I was in my local library and a staff person from the Supervisor of Elections was there registering people to vote. I explained to this person that my registration application had been rejected and could not be corrected in time to have voted in the November 2006 elections. I was informed by the staff member at the Library that my Social Security digits had been incorrectly entered into the voter registration system, and that two of the digits had been transposed.

8. The staff member attempted to help me re-apply. I submitted another voter registration application with the assistance of this staff member and am now a registered voter.


9. I am upset that I was prevented from voting in 2006 when I am an eligible voter. I believe that voting and my right to vote are very important. When I was a young man, I registered voters in Mississippi. During the 2006 election, I was eager to vote for candidates that

**shared my beliefs, values, and have the conception of leadership I wanted my country to follow.**

**I believe that the practice of voting is crucial for a functional government and society.**

**DECLARATION OF  
OKE UWECHUE**

I, Okechukwu Uwechue, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am 40 years old, a United States citizen, and a resident of the state of Florida. I live at 10226 NW 36th Street, Coral Springs, Florida, 33065. I have been a United States citizen since March of 2006. I have never been convicted of a felony, and I have never been found mentally incapacitated with respect to voting.

2. I moved to Florida approximately six years ago.

3. I occasionally use "Oke" as my first name. I sometimes use it on official government papers.

4. My Social Security card lists my name as Okechukwu A. Uwechue.

5. After becoming a citizen, I attempted to register to vote for the first time. I completed a voter registration application and mailed it to the Broward Supervisor of Elections.

6. Some time later, I received a letter stating that my voter registration application had been rejected because there was some problem with my Social Security number. The letter

included a photocopy of my registration application. I reviewed both the contents of the letter and the copy of my application. Upon review, I determined that the Social Security digits I listed on my application exactly matched the number on my Social Security card. I also determined that all of the other information I provided on my application was correct.

7. I was so puzzled by the letter informing me that there was a problem with my Social Security number that I asked my wife to review the letter and the application and to verify that the listed information was accurate. She verified that the Social Security digits that I had listed were accurate.

8. I was angry that my application was rejected even though the information I had provided on my application was correct and accurate. I did not attempt to register again because I do not know what information on my original application caused my application to be rejected.

9. If the attorneys in the case had not contacted me, I would not understand what the letter meant when it stated that my Social Security number could not be verified. The letter I was sent did not describe the problem adequately or tell me how to fix it.

10. Since that time, I have learned that Florida's voter registration records indicate that the information on my registration form may not have matched information in other government records, and that this problem may have prevented me from registering and voting in 2006.

11. I am very upset that I was prevented from voting. I believe voting is very important. I am angry that I was unable to vote in the first election in which I was eligible to vote.

**DECLARATION OF  
ALAINA R. FOTIU-  
WOJTOWICZ**

I, Alaina R. Fotiu-Wojtowicz, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am 26 years old, a United States citizen, and a resident of the state of Florida. I live at 920 SW 22nd Street, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, 33315.
2. I have never been convicted of a felony, and I have never been found mentally incapacitated with respect to voting.
3. I moved to Florida in August of 2006.
4. In September of 2006, I attempted to register to vote in Florida in time for the November 2006 elections. I was aware that the deadline for voter registration was approaching, and I wanted to ensure that I registered in time. I downloaded a registration form from the Internet and completed it. Because I did not have a Florida driver's license at the time, I wrote the last four digits of my Social Security number as identification on the form. After I completed the form, I mailed it to the Broward County Board of Elections.

5. On or about October 15, 2006, I received a letter informing me that my application could not be processed because the Social Security digits I submitted on my application were incorrect. I was not given information as to what was incorrect about the digits I submitted. I do not believe that I submitted any incorrect information.

6. Shortly after receiving this letter, I attempted to contact the Broward County Supervisor of Elections via phone. After several failed attempts, I contacted the Broward County Supervisor of Elections on October 18, 2006 via email. In that email, I explained that I had received a letter stating my application could not be processed and sought assistance in resolving the matter so that I would be able to vote in the upcoming election. The person I corresponded with at the Supervisor of Elections office was Jared Dawson. We exchanged a series of emails, and I was eventually told to mail them copies of my Social Security card and driver's license.

7. I mailed them a copy of my Social Security card and my Michigan driver's license on or about October 23, 2006.

8. On November 4, 2006, only two days before the elections, I received a small card in the mail which I believed was my voter registration card. I confirmed receipt of this card on Saturday, November 4, 2006 via email.

9. When I arrived at my polling place on Election Day and presented my card, the poll worker told me she did not recognize the card and that my name was not on the registration list. I told the poll worker that my card authorized me to vote. The poll worker made a phone call and verified with someone that my card permitted me to cast a regular ballot. I cast a regular ballot via machine. After I voted, the poll worker collected my card and did not return it to me.

10. I went to a great deal of trouble to try to register to vote, including sending multiple emails, making numerous phone calls to election officials, and following up as necessary. I worry that other people less persistent than I would not have been able to get a registration issue resolved.


11. I was very assertive when demanding that I be allowed to cast a regular ballot after the poll worker told me that she did not recognize my card. I know that if I had been less assertive, I would not have been able to vote by regular ballot in November 2006. I worry that other people less assertive than I would not have been able to cast a regular ballot.

12. Despite having authenticated my Social Security digits and voting in the 2006 elections, I still receive notices informing me that the voter registration application I previously submitted could not be processed because I provided incorrect Social Security digits. The most recent notice I received is dated August 23, 2007 and was postmarked on August 28, 2007. A true and correct copy is included as Attachment A to this Declaration.

13. I believe voting is tremendously important, as it provides citizens our only real opportunity to influence governmental policy, particularly at the local level, where our voices have the most impact.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Florida that the foregoing is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

- Complete all information in the black boxes on the application. (BOXES #2,3,4,5,6,7,8 & 16)

### Deadline Information:

If this is a new registration application, the date the completed application is postmarked or hand delivered to a driver's license office, a voter registration agency, an armed forces recruitment office, the Division of Elections, or the office of any supervisor of elections in the state will be your registration date. If this is a new Florida application, you must be registered for at least 29 days before you can vote in an election. If your application is complete and you are qualified as a voter, a voter information card will be mailed to you.

**DECLARATION OF STEPHEN  
LEINEN**

I, Stephen Leinen, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am 68 years old, a United States citizen, and a resident of the state of Florida. My address is 314 S. 57<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Hollywood, Florida, 33023. I have never been convicted of a felony, and I have never been found mentally incapacitated with respect to voting.
2. I moved to Florida in approximately June of 2005 with my wife. Prior to living in Florida, my wife and I lived in New York where I worked as a professor and was chair of the sociology department at my college. I am also a retired New York City Police Lieutenant. I was a regular voter when I lived in New York state.
3. On or about January 31, 2006, I applied to vote with my wife. I believe that we applied at a local court house in Hollywood.
4. I never received a letter or notice indicating that there was a problem with my application.
5. I went to vote in the November 2006 elections at my local polling station. When I presented myself to vote and showed my identification, a poll worker informed me that my name

was not on the registration list, but did not offer any reason as to why I was not on the list. My wife, who was on the list, and I explained that we applied to register at the same time, but the poll worker informed me that I could not vote by regular ballot. The poll worker said I had the option of voting by provisional ballot and informed me that the validity might be disputed, but did not tell me what I had to do to get my ballot counted or how I could find out if my ballot had been counted.

6. I have been informed that my ballot was rejected and did not count.


7. I have learned that there is a Florida law which requires that a Social Security number on a registration form be "verified" before a voter can be registered. While I never received any indication that my information was unable to be verified, I have now been informed that my information was not verified at some point during the registration process. I have also been informed that I am still identified on state records as unregistered, despite the fact that I attempted to register with my wife almost nine months before the 2006 election, and despite the fact that I was eligible to register and vote in Florida.

8. I do not know why my Social Security digits could not be verified. I do not believe I submitted incorrect digits.

9. I was interested in voting in the 2006 elections, especially given the state of the world. I believe the right to vote is fundamental and important.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Florida that the foregoing  
is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

**DECLARATION OF  
AMRITA N. HANSRA**

I, Amrita Hansra, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am 52 years old, a United States citizen, and a resident of the state of Florida. My address is 3607 Star Board Avenue, Cooper City, Florida 33026. I have never been convicted of a felony, and I have never been found mentally incapacitated with respect to voting.
2. I became a naturalized citizen in September 2006.
3. On or about October 6, 2006, I attempted to register to vote by mail. I completed the form and mailed it in. I remember the date because I applied at the same time as my children, and my daughter's Voter Information Card, which I have readily accessible, lists her registration date as October 6, 2006.
4. I do not believe that I ever received a letter or notice indicating that there was a problem with my application.
5. I went to vote in the November 2006 elections at my local polling station. When I presented myself to vote, a poll worker informed me that my name was not on the registration

list, but did not offer any reason. I completed the forms the poll worker handed me and voted in the manner instructed.

6. I have been informed that I voted by provisional ballot and that my ballot was rejected. Until I was so informed, I never knew that I voted by provisional ballot. Until I was so informed, I never knew that my ballot did not count.

7. The poll worker never communicated to me that I was not able to cast a regular ballot, nor did the poll worker explain to me what steps I needed to take to ensure that my provisional ballot was counted.

8. I have learned that there is a Florida law which requires that a driver's license number on a registration form be "verified" before a voter can be registered. While I never received any indication that my information was unable to be verified, I have now been informed that my information was not verified at some point during the registration process. I have also been informed that my provisional ballot was rejected for a reason listed in records as "Voter not in Register, eligibility not verified."

9. I have been informed that state voting records list my driver's license number as XXXXXXXXXXX7460. My driver's license number is actually XXXXXXXXXXX7640. I believe that I submitted my driver's license number correctly on my application form.

10. I do not know why my driver's license number was not verified. I also do not know why I was not listed on the registration rolls, but I reasonably believe it may have had something to do with the verification problem. I do not understand why my provisional ballot was not counted. I registered to vote before the deadline, and I am eligible to register and vote in the state of Florida.



11. I have since learned that I was able to become registered at some point, but not soon enough to have my ballot count in 2006. I am very upset that my ballot did not count. I am also very upset the poll worker never informed me that I was not voting by regular ballot or what I needed to do to get my ballot to count. I am a new citizen and I believe I am entitled to all rights that all citizens possess. The right to vote is one of the most fundamental of those rights. That right was denied to me when my ballot was not counted.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of Florida that the foregoing is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.
