SCHEDULING ORDER

Upon review of Defendant's motion for modification of the scheduling order [54], the Court establishes the schedule below for the GA NAACP and Thompson plaintiffs' racial gerrymandering claims. The time limits for adding parties, amending the pleadings, filing motions, completing discovery, and discussing settlement shall be in keeping with the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and the Local Rules of this Court, except as modified here:

If the parties anticipate filing cross-motions, counsel should establish a briefing process and schedule that will avoid duplicative briefing by, for example, providing for the filing of consolidated briefs in support of one party's motion and in opposition to the opposing party's motion. If counsel agree to modify this scheduling order to this end, they should notify the courtroom deputy for Judge Timothy C.
