# WHO DRAWS THE DISTRICTS?

#### POLITICAL APPOINTEE COMMISSION

- Eleven members with the four legislative majority and minority leaders each selecting one, the governor selecting three, and the chief justice of the state Supreme Court selecting four
- No more than six commissioners may be of the same political party
- No more than four commissioners may be members of the legislature
- At least one but no more than four commissioners must be from each congressional district
- At least one commissioner must reside west of the continental divide

### **HOW ARE DISTRICTS DRAWN?**

#### **Process**

- Political appointee commission draws the lines
- State Supreme Court automatically reviews the plan

# State-Level Criteria

- Overall range of no more than 5 percent between most- and least-populous districts
- Compactness
- Ranked: No Contiguity
  - Follow political boundaries
  - Preserve communities of interest

# Public Hearings

 Required to be held in several places throughout the state within 45 days after preliminary plan is published

#### **Timing**

- Draft plans must be approved within 113 days after the commission is convened or after census data is available, whichever is later
- Final plans must be submitted to the State Supreme Court for review at least 123 days prior to the beginning of precinct caucuses or other candidate selection process in the second year following the census
- If the state Supreme Court disapproves of the plan, it must allow the commission enough time to redraw the plan and submit it to the secretary of state at least 55 days prior to the beginning of precinct caucuses or other candidate selection process
