

<b>WHO DRAW</b>	<b>S THE DISTRICTS?</b>		
POLITICAL APPOINTEE COMMISSION			

• Nine members: House and Senate majority and minority leaders each select two. Those initial eight select the ninth member by a six-eighths vote

## **HOW ARE DISTRICTS DRAWN?**

Process	<ul> <li>Political appointee commission draws the lines</li> <li>Simple majority required to pass a plan</li> <li>State Supreme Court will review the plan if a registered voter petitions</li> </ul>
<b>State-Level Criteria</b> Ranked: No	<ul> <li>Follow boundaries of basic island units</li> <li>No undue favoritism toward a person or political faction</li> <li>Contiguity except when districts include more than one island</li> <li>Compactness</li> <li>Follow census tract and geographic boundaries where possible</li> <li>Nest House districts in Senate districts where practicable</li> <li>No more than four members per district</li> <li>Preserve communities of socioeconomic interest where practicable</li> </ul>
Public Hearings	• At least one hearing in each basic island unit after initial maps are proposed
Timing	• The commission must file its plans within 150 days of commission members being selected (which must happen by May 1 in years ending in 1)

Timing	• Same as for state legislative di	stricts
